

Despite the prevailing cold weather the Six-Bell Practice at Iffley was well attended, with several methods successfully trialled, ranging from Little Bob to York. *Hugh Deam.*



Every time Margaret Marsh goes back to her native Australia, she rings at this fine Church in the middle of Sydney. This is her description of it:

Christ Church St Laurence (10) in Sydney is of the Anglo Catholic tradition. It is situated in Central Sydney near the main railway terminus. Once the land all around the site was a very early Australian cemetery named the Old Sydney Burial Ground but burial was discontinued from the 1860s and all were disinterred and relocated Land was granted in



1842 for a church and a sufficiently finished building occupied in 1845. The spire and tower were completed by prominent colonial architect, Edmund Blacket in 1855, and the bells were installed soon after although the original six bells had arrived by ship from England in 1853. The other four were added in 1984. I first rang in this church in 2008 and will ring there again this Christmas. *Margaret Marsh*.
