



The White Family Plaque




On Saturday 26th July a large gathering of the White Family, Blue Plaque officials in their regalia, the Guild Master and a fair host of bell ringers met at The Greyhound Pub in Besselsleigh to witness the unveiling of the Blue Plaque in honour of Alfred White, 1804-

1876, bell hanger, founder of Whites of Appleton and innkeeper of The Greyhound. Despite the heat of the brilliant sunshine and the passing traffic, Brian White enthralled the company, speaking most interestingly about his renowned ancestor and the history of Whites. The refreshments afterwards in the cool Greyhound gardens were most welcome and everyone attending seemed delighted to have taken part in yet another historical moment in the Whites of Appleton tradition. **Katie Lane**
