


Monday 18th August 2014 General Ringing Practice at Yarnton (6)

The weather was kind to us as we arrived at the lovely 12th century church of St Bartholomew in Yarnton on Saturday 9th August !



The Church has remarkable treasures including many wonderful stained glass windows which were collected Alderman Fletcher at the end of the 18th century, and date from many periods. The glass in the Spencer Chapel is of the 17th century and is said to be the biggest collection of painted armorial glass in the diocese. Fletcher also presented the octagonal font in the nave, obtained from the church of St Michael and is probably 12th century. The ring of 6 was installed by the influential Sir Thomas Spencer who also built the Chapel and Tower and owned the Manor House which has recently been sold. Only one of the bells has been reset since that time, and all,



except the second bell have this inscription on it, Sir Thomas Spencer, Knight and Baronet, Lord of this Manor, gave me,1620. The bells were retuned in 1987 by the Whitechapel Foundry, London, and the following year were rehung by Whites of Appleton. The bells are heavier than the normal bells

which we ring around the Oxford Churches, but were a pleasure to master. We rang some Bob Doubles and Steadman, and a few call changes. We left in good form and still in good weather having enjoyed this quiet area that used to be one of the main routes into Oxford. *Ginger Andrews*
