A Practice at Marsh Gibbon (5) on Sunday 31st August

The extensive village that exists today is the result of several diverse hamlets merging over the centuries. In 1437 the village was granted to an alms-house trust founded in Ewelme. Two centuries later (1617) James I

granted the master-ship of the trust to the Regius Professor of Medicine at Oxford University, a position that still pertains today. The parish church is mostly 13th century and cruciform in its design, with the imposing tower having been rebuilt late in the 19th century. The two oldest bells (second and fourth) both date to 1678, cast by Richard III Chandler of Drayton Parslow. The bells were long rung from the ground floor, but since the construction of a gallery they have become a much more attractive proposition to ring. **Hugh Deam**.
